A MESSAGE FROM OUR FOUNDER



Founded on a mission to care for the underserved, OUM is committed to helping qualified individuals become highly trained medical practitioners. Many plan to practice in rural communities and other areas experiencing physician shortages.

Inspired Ambition

OUM uncovers excellence in its candidates. With many incoming students having already earned Master's or Doctoral degrees, OUM students set the bar high. OUM's unique curriculum is the solution they sought to help them earn their medical degree.



OUM'S ROOTS IN SAMOA

All OUM students gain diverse clinical experience during a required four-week elective at OUM's home in the South Pacific, the island nation of Independent Samoa.

Located south of the equator, and just west of the International Dateline, Samoa is home to warm, friendly people with a rich Polynesian culture. Two-thirds of Samoa's population live on the largest island, Upolu, where the capital, Apia, is located. Apia is the business and commercial center and main national port.

The National Health Complex is located in an Apia suburb and houses OUM and Tupua Tamasese Meaole (TTM) Hospital, the medical school's primary teaching facility. Student housing is located within walking distance of the health complex.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Applicants Must Have:

- Recognized Bachelor's degree or higher from an accredited tertiary institution.
- GPA of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale, 5.5 on a 7.0 scale, or its equivalent.
- Proof of citizenship or permanent residency in Aotearoa New Zealand, Australia, Canada, Samoa, or the United States.

OUM students come from a variety of backgrounds. A Science major is not a prerequisite for entry because the Basic Sciences are included in OUM's foundational medical school curriculum

The Medical College Admission Test (MCAT) and the Graduate Australian Medical School Admissions Test (GAMSAT) are not required.

OUM currently accepts students who are citizens or permanent residents of American Samoa, Australia, Canada, Aotearoa New Zealand, Samoa, and the United States, where the University has relationships with teaching hospitals and clinics and where it is most knowledgeable about the licensing requirements for international medical graduates (IMGs). This guarantees our students access to their requisite clinical rotations and assures a smoother transition through their hurdle exams into postgraduate training and clinical practice.

English-Language Requirement

All instruction at OUM is in English and students must be fully fluent in the language. Candidates whose first language is not English may be exempt from this requirement if their Bachelor's degree is from a university whose curriculum is delivered in English.

Candidates whose native language is not English may need to demonstrate competency by submitting test results from one of the services that evaluate language proficiency (IELTS, TOEFL iBT, or OET).

The items listed below are required to apply for admission to OUM.

Please complete all fields in the application, which is designed to save your information so you may complete it in more than one sitting.

Application Deadline

OUM welcomes two intakes each year – in January and July. Application deadlines are September 1 for the January intake and March 1 for the July intake. Only complete applications will be accepted and must be received by the intake deadline.

Application Checklist

- University/College Certified or Official Transcripts: From ALL institutions attended. Certified transcripts must come directly from the institution. We do not accept uncertified copies of transcripts sent directly from the applicant. Note: Some transcripts may require a formal evaluation report to meet admissions requirements.
- · Essay on why you want to become a medical doctor
- 3 Letters of Recommendation (1 from a medical doctor)
- Professional Résumé/CV
- Valid Government-Issued Photo ID
- English Proficiency Confirmation

Post-Acceptance Checklist

Upon acceptance to the OUM program, students must also provide the following Post-Acceptance documents by December 1 for the January intake, and June 1 for the July intake:

- Criminal Background Check
- Immunization Records
- Passport-Style Photo

OUM MD PROGRAM

Program Highlights

- OUM's Doctor of Medicine (MD) program is typically completed in ~4.5 to 5 years.
- Online pre-clinical curriculum allows students to study from anywhere in the world for approximately the first two years.
- Didactic material is taught via live, interactive lectures and engaging faculty-led case discussions.
- Our Clinical Transition Units prepare students for 72 weeks of clinical rotations.
- All students undertake a Research Project resulting in a publishable manuscript that may enhance post-graduate applications.
- There is a required four-week rotation in Samoa.
- OUM's MD Program has WFME recognition and is internationally accredited by the Philippine Accrediting Association of Schools, Colleges and Universities (PAASCU).



CURRICULUM DELIVERY

Through a blend of traditional face-to-face learning and real-time virtual classrooms, OUM offers students a curriculum that utilizes the best of today's e-learning capabilities.

A custom Student Information System (SIS), Zoom, Moodle (Learning Management System), and online library resources such as Elsevier's ClinicalKey are the focal points of OUM's medical education program. As a result, students' success may depend upon their comfort level using these technologies.

The University's curriculum content and delivery are continuously monitored and updated by medical scholars based in Aotearoa New Zealand, Australia, Canada, Samoa, and the US.














OUR ALUMNI
